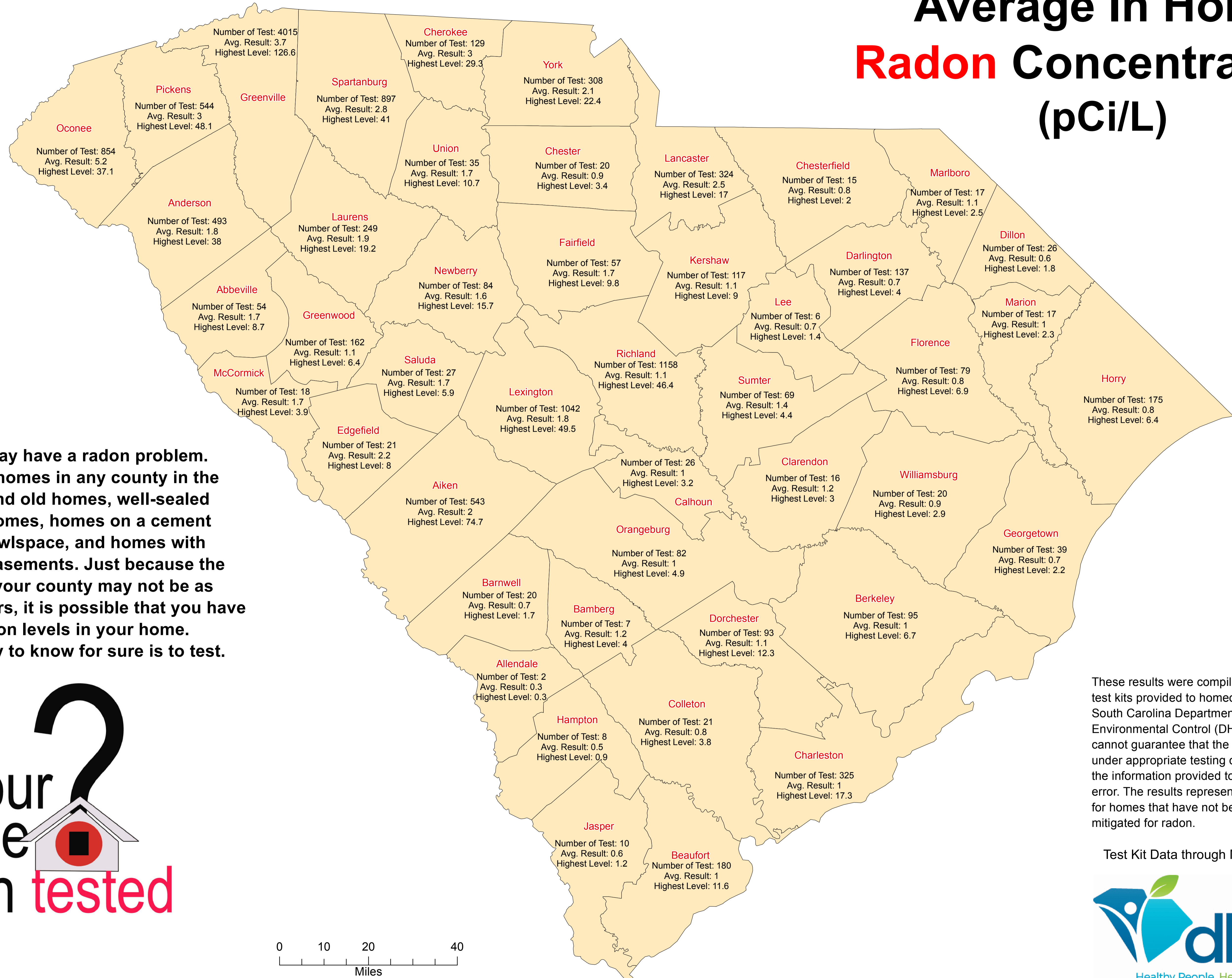


Average In Home Radon Concentrations (pCi/L)



Any home may have a radon problem. This means homes in any county in the state; new and old homes, well-sealed and drafty homes, homes on a cement slab or a crawlspace, and homes with or without basements. Just because the average for your county may not be as high as others, it is possible that you have elevated radon levels in your home. The only way to know for sure is to test.

These results were compiled from radon test kits provided to homeowners by the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC). DHEC cannot guarantee that the kits were used under appropriate testing conditions or that the information provided to us is without error. The results represent initial tests for homes that have not been previously mitigated for radon.
